Itinerary

Day 1

Arrival in Cairo

Once you arrive at Cairo International Airport, our guide will be waiting for you with a sign bearing your name on it to transport you to your hotel. The guide will help with check-in and go through your 5-day classic Cairo and Luxor tour package itinerary, explaining the pick-up times and any options for the following days. Have your first night in Cairo and enjoy a welcome drink.

Day 2

Tour to Giza Pyramids, Saqqara and Memphis

On this day trip, you will be accompanied by your professional tour guide from Best Destination Tours after having breakfast. First on your list will be the Giza Pyramids, the Great Pyramid of Cheops, where you will be acquainted with how it was made and that it is one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, which is 230 m on every side and 147 meters in height. After that, proceed to the Three Pyramids of the Fourth Dynasty, Chephren and Mycerinus, both successors of Cheops. During your journey, you will enjoy the unique experience of private tours in Cairo, offering a more personalized exploration. Next, you will have an opportunity to visit the very impressive Sphinx, the body of a lion with the head of a man, and the Valley Temple, where forty ways of mummification were used.

Later, you will go to Saqqara, where you will enjoy a visit to the Step Pyramid complex, the old stone structure still existing, as well as penetrate Teti's Pyramid, whose interior decorations are impressive. Continue to the Tombs of the Nobles. The walls of these tombs show scenes of everyday life in Ancient Egypt. After satisfying your appetite for delicious food, visit Memphis, the capital that reigned in Egypt for over a thousand years. Also, explore its open-air museum where the alabaster Sphinx and the grand statue of Ramses II are exhibited.

Day 3

Fly to Luxor for Your Luxor Trip

Have your breakfast at the hotel, then transfer to Cairo International Airport for a flight to Luxor early in the morning. You'll start your day by visiting the west bank of Luxor, where you will pay a visit to the Valley of the Kings, where you will learn about the

construction and evolution of royal tombs since it was built to protect the tomb from robbery. Get to see the Colossi of Memnon, enormous statues sitting majestically of Pharaoh Amenhotep III and his mortuary temple. Then, you will head from there to the stunning Temple of Queen Hatshepsut, one of the few female pharaohs of Egypt, built by one of the brilliant architects of the New Kingdom, also called Deir El Bahari.

Later in the afternoon, cross the Nile River to its East Bank and explore one of the most sacred and venerated sites of ancient Egypt: the sprawling Karnak temple complex. Check into your hotel with time to rest. Later in the evening, begin a guided walk at Luxor Temple, where vistas of illuminated pillars and statues are almost magical. In the evening, take in the stunning Luxor attractions.

Day 4

Back to Cairo and Cairo Sightseeing

Enjoy breakfast before your flight back to Cairo. You'll start your city tour by visiting the Egyptian Museum, which hosts the largest collection of artifacts of ancient Egypt in the world, including the treasures of Tutankhamun and many others. Next, during your Cairo Islamic tour, proceed to the Citadel of Saladin, one of the most interesting forts in Cairo and one of the most important parts of the history of the city, where the stunning Mohamed Ali Alabaster Mosque lies, offering great panoramic views over Islamic Cairo.

Then, proceed to Coptic Cairo and see the Fortress of Babylon, a product of the Roman Empire; the Hanging Church, which is dedicated to the Virgin Mary; and the Church of St. Sergius, whose crypt was a refuge of the Holy Family. On your Cairo city tours, you will also visit Ben Ezra Synagogue, where it is said that the basket carrying Moses was found. Before heading back to the hotel, you will visit Khan El Khalili, Cairo's most sprawling, bustling

bazaar.
