Itinerary

Day 1

Arrival in Casablanca and Transfer to Rabat

On landing at Casablanca Airport, your driver/guide will be at Gate 2 to meet you outside the airport terminal. From there, you start the northward journey toward Rabat, the capital of Morocco, for a hotel check-in for the night. This marks the beginning of one of the best Middle East tours in Morocco, promising a unique and memorable experience as part of our well-planned Morocco tours.

Activities: Transfer from Casablanca Airport to Hotel (Rabat)

Day 2

Rabat - Meknes - Volubilis - Fez

After breakfast, embark on a guided tour of [Rabat](#), delving into the historical richness of the city. The tour will take you to Chellah and Kasbah Oudaya. Following your time in Rabat, you'll be free to explore the souks and bazaars of Rabat's old medina. This experience is a highlight of many popular Middle East trips and one of the most authentic tours to Middle East destinations. Later, head to 'Café Maure' on the banks of the Bouregreg River to unwind for Moroccan tea time, blending mint tea with Moroccan delights like Kaab Ghazal and Ghariba.

We will continue the trip to Fez, stopping at Volubilis and Meknes along the way. Due to its outstanding value, the archaeological site of Volubilis is granted UNESCO World Heritage Status. There, an able guide will take you through the remains of the Roman and Berber civilizations that flourished once. Then, after, proceed towards the City of the Imperial Meknes, a less commonly visited city in Morocco. Built by Moulay Ismail, who intended it to be the 'Versailles of Morocco,' you will meet your local guide to visit the famous gate of Bab El Mansour and Lhri, which are essential to the character of the city. Onwards to Fez. This route is a favorite among trips to Middle East for travelers looking for unique experiences during their Middle East holidays. For your information: Kaab Ghazal means the hoof of the deer in Arabic. These, along with Ghariba and Mint Tea, are symbols of Moroccan hospitality.

Overnight in Fez.

Meals: Breakfast, Tea break.

Local experience: Café Maure overlooking the "Abouregrag" River.

Day 3

Exploring Fez

After breakfast, the guided tour of the imperial city will begin. Fez was the capital city of the kingdom before 1912. Today's visit will focus mainly on the Medina of [Fes](#), founded in the 9th

century and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site, home to the oldest university in the world. This experience is a highlight of many Middle East vacations and is featured in the best Middle East tours in Morocco for travelers seeking history and culture.

Your local guide will take you around to many prestigious sights and highlights such as the Bou-Inania and Attarin Medresas, tanneries, Ess-Seffarine square, the tomb of Moulay Driss, Nejjarine square, and the disputants of cabinet makers, as well as the Jewish quarter called 'Mellah'. Mali fully embraces the acts of Moroccan culture by visiting a pottery workshop under a master potter. Following lunch at a local eatery, you may either return to the hotel or walk around the old town at your leisure. This day is a memorable part of Morocco tours and a key experience for those exploring Middle East trips focused on authentic cultural immersion.

Additional information: One of the biggest and best-known Sufi festivals in the world takes place here each October, featuring performers from around the globe.

Day 4

From Fez, Through Beni-Mellal, to Marrakech

After breakfast, you'll be picked up by your vehicle to commence the 4-5 hours' drive to another imperial city: Marrakech. You'll pass through some charming villages of Imouzar and Ifrane. Later in the day, you will be descending to Beni Mellal, the most significant agricultural centre of [Morocco](#). Then, you will continue your way to Marrakech. Once you arrive in Marrakech, the hotel will welcome you for check-in and your stay. This journey is a highlight of many tours to Middle East and a memorable segment of trips to Middle East for those seeking to experience Morocco's diverse landscapes.

Overnight in Marrakech.

Day 5

Unique Places in Marrakech

Waking up and enjoying Marrakech is a dream for many; thus, this day must be dedicated to making the most out of it. After breakfast, our guide and driver will meet you for a guided tour of the "Ochre City." We will first visit the Majorelle Garden in the morning, named after the French painter Jacques Majorelle, who greatly endowed this art creation with his time and passion. After exploring Majorelle, we will proceed to Menara. Although its Arabic name means "lighthouse," it is essentially a pavilion surrounding a basin and a garden planted with orchards and olive groves. Next is a visit to the Koutoubia Mosque and passing through the Jewish quarter called Mellah. Following lunch at a local restaurant, conclude your visit with a carriage ride, or "Koutchi", to Jamaa El Fnaa. This itinerary perfectly captures the essence of Middle East holidays and is a highlight of many unforgettable Middle East vacations.

The more you know: [Marrakesh](#) is considered a holy city; Moroccans call it "the land of the seven men" in reverence for the great religious and Sufi scholars who lived for knowledge and worship.

Overnight: Marrakech.

Meals: Breakfast and Lunch.

Local experience: Kotchi (Horse Carriage Tour).

Day 6

Free Day in Marrakech

After breakfast at your hotel, take the free day for yourself to explore Marrakech. Make your own Marrakech experience and interact with the locals, live in "Marrakechi" style, seek stories

from storytellers and entertainment from snake charmers: Let Marrakech take you! This day is a perfect addition to the best Middle East tours in Morocco and a memorable part of any Morocco tour itinerary.

From Marrakech to Casablanca

Wake up and relish a delightful breakfast at your hotel before setting off for Casablanca.

Upon arrival in [Casablanca](#), you will be welcomed by your local guide to tour the Hassan II mosque, a work of art standing tall on the Atlantic coastline of the city. This is followed by a city tour, particularly the corniche, the Habous quarters, and an exterior view of the Royal Palace.
